Surgical Mission

February 6-13, 2000. Sr. Eva led a very successful mission to Maasin, Leyte, one of the poorest towns in the Philippines. About 149 patients underwent surgery that included thyroid, harelip, abdominal tumors, cataract, and others.

Feeding Center

December 24, 1999. The Foundation opened a new soup kitchen in Ermita, Manila. On opening day, 230 street children were fed.

Hospital for the Poor

January 11, 2000. Groundbreaking rites took place on Coastal Road, Parañaque, Manila, future site of the Hospital. The event was well attended by government officials, volunteers and the media. PMM's Maricel Bretault was there to witness the event.

On January 15, 2000, I visited the office of Sr. Eva on Ermita, Manila during a "Vision-Mission" seminar for the Foundation's staff. I had the opportunity to give a short talk to the staff about the goals of PMM. I informed them of the various fund-raising activities scheduled in December, such as the Misa de Gallo (dawn mass), December 16-24, and "Christmas letters to family & friends". I also told them of PMM's plans to conduct other fund-raising activities for the year 2000. My brief talk was received enthusiastically with several rounds of rousing applause and elicited beautiful smiles in their innocent faces. I did not realize that PMM's promise to send them support would inspire them so much... give them hope...as they feel they are not alone in their work of helping the poor - that 10,000 miles away are people who share their cause to uplift and preserve the dignity of the poor. The experience was equally inspiring for me as I saw and felt the gratitude of the Foundation's caregivers. Overworked and underpaid, they are truly living examples of those that give more and receive less.
