CROSSLINK INTERNATIONAL TO HELP STREET CHILDREN CLINIC

CrossLink International, Inc. has agreed to send medicines and supplies to aid the street children of ChildHope Asia Philippines in Manila. IMF CIVIC PROGRAM AWARDS GRANT TO FOLPMI FEEDING CENTER FOR MALNOURISHED CHILDREN

Through a grant received in May 2002 from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) Civic Program, the Foundation of Our Lady of Peace Mission, Inc. (FOLPMI) opened a feeding center in Barangay Sitio Puting Bato and Barangay Santo Nino, both in Navotas, Manila. Sixty preschool children are served one full meal daily for one year. Their caretakers are provided livelihood training, nutrition education, parenting, and basic health care classes.

Last September 30, PMM submitted another grant proposal to the IMF Civic Program for funds to open a similar program at the Aeta Resettlement area in the province of Zambales.

PMM APPROVES FUNDING: ONE SOCIAL WORKER

In April, PMM approved funding a social worker for the Foundation of Our Lady of Peace Mission, Inc. (FOLPMI). The social worker will facilitate the needs of direct beneficiaries of the feeding centers in Navotas, under the bridge in Paco, and the Aeta resettlement community and its livelihood component. This person will be responsible for submitting progress reports to PMM and its donor agencies regarding activities in the feeding centers and the Hospital for the Poor, particularly its emergency room.

FIL-AM ASSOCIATION OF MANASSAS AND GREATER DC AREA TO SUPPORT HOSPITAL FOR THE POOR

The association President, Mr. Danilo Lunaria, visited the FOLPMI "Hospital for the Poor" in February 2003. The association has agreed to "adopt" and provide financial support yearly to the Emergency/Out-Patient Unit of the hospital. PMM GRANT WRITING TEAM SUBMITS PROPOSAL

After months of preparation, PMM's Grant Writing Team submitted its largest request for funds to date. On May 2, 2003, a proposal was submitted to the Development Marketplace, a grant proposal competition sponsored by the World Bank Group.

PMM requested \$125,000 to fund CHAP's Street Education Program in Metro Manila. If awarded, the funds will be used to expand CHAP's existing pilot program to include ten additional Street Educators and forty-five additional Junior Health Care Workers.

The expansion of the program will allow 2,500 to 3,000 street children in five cities of Metro Manila to receive alternative education on children's rights, protection against sexual abuse, dangers of substance abuse, basic health care, para-legal education, and literacy/numeracy.

The Religious of Notre Dame Mission (RNDM) is a PMM partner in the province of Sultan Kudarat, Mindanao in the southern part of the Philippines. RNDM's mission is to the Dulangan Manobo tribe in Kulaman Valley.

In March 2000, the first Manobo young woman graduated from high school. In March 2002, more Manobo girls

graduated. For several years, one of them, Corazon Ondong, had been saying she wanted to study nursing. She comes from an extremely poor but loving family who are proud of being Indigenous People of the Philippines even though this has meant marginalization in many aspects of life and loss of ancestral lands. The family income for a year is about 15,000 pesos or \$300.

Corazon is a young woman of courage and determination, with natural leadership qualities. After graduation, she was accepted at the College of Nursing at Notre Dame University in Cotabato City.

We are pleased to report that this spring, Corazon successfully finished her second year of nursing studies at the university. The standards at the university are very high, which makes us even more proud of her achievement. Upon completion of her studies, Corazon wishes to return to Kulaman to work for her people, particularly to care for women and children.
